## Folded Flying Geese

## Cutting

2" x 4" finished Units
Fabric A: cut (2) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares
Fabric B: cut (1) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle


3" $\times 6$ " finished Units
Fabric A: cut (2) $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares Fabric B: cut (1) $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle

## Fold and Sew

1. Fold the fabric B rectangles in half with wrong sides together and press the fold line.

2. Place the folded rectangle on the right side of fabric A square with the folded raw edges of fabric $B$ even with two adjacent sides of the fabric $A$ square. There will be $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ of the fabric A square showing underneath the folded side of the fabric B rectangle.
3. Place a second fabric A square on top of the folded B piece, right side facing down and wrong side facing up. Stitch along the side of the stacked fabrics on the raw edge side with the folded edge of fabric B at the bottom.

4. Fold out the top fabric A square and press the seam line.

5. Pick up the top corner of the fabric B piece while holding the bottom corner in place with your other hand. Tug fabric B gently down to the opposite corner of the pressed out fabric A square to make the folded Flying Geese triangle. Press the diagonal fold lines of the Flying Geese folded triangle with bottom corners
