

## Double 4 patch 10" square finished

Please use bright kid friendly colors. Primary and secondary colors (red, blue, yellow and orange, green and purple) will work great. We are requesting 2 blocks from each member by the January meeting

For each block you will need:
Focus fabric
Two $51 / 2 "$ squares
Coordinating fabric 1
Four 3" squares (13" strip)
Coordinating fabric 2
Four 3" squares (13" strip)

Use $1 / 4 "$ seam allowances.

1. Make 4 patch units using 3 " squares:

Sew together a fabric 1 square with fabric 2 square. Repeat 3 times.
2. Pair 2 of these units and sew together to form the 4 patch unit. Repeat. This will yield $51 / 2$ " squares.
3. Sew a focus fabric square to the 4 patch. Repeat.
4. Sew Step 3 units together to form
 the Double 4 patch block.


## Double 4 patch 10" square finished

Two $5^{1 / 2 "}$ " squares
Coordinating fabric 1
Four 3" squares (13" strip)
Coordinating fabric 2
Four 3" squares (13" strip)

Use $1 / 4 "$ seam allowances.

1. Make 4 patch units using 3 " squares:

Sew together a fabric 1 square with fabric 2 square. Repeat 3 times.
2. Pair 2 of these units and sew together to form the 4 patch unit. Repeat. This will yield $51 / 2$ " squares.
3. Sew a focus fabric square to the 4 patch. Repeat.
4. Sew Step 3 units together to form
 the Double 4 patch block.
