

Toilet Paper Roll

Supplies

(1) 5 3/8" x 13 1/2" main fabric

(1) 5 3/8" x 13 1/2" inside fabric

(2) 1 1/2" x 10 3/4" fabric strips (your choice of either main or inner fabric)

Usual sewing supplies (machine, thread, cutter, etc)

Directions



Cut 1 rectangle of each of your fabrics.



Cut 2 fabric strips (you can cut these strips 1 3/4" instead but don't go wider.)



Make a small dot 1" in on the right side of all the short ends of your inner fabric.



Sew your fabric strips into long tubes, turn right side out and iron flat.



Place a fabric strip lengthwise on the right side of the inner fabric so it straddles the dot, lay the main fabric on top so you have right sides together and pin to hold the strip in place. (Have kept yellow strip back so show the dot but you want to be right to edge of fabric.)

Repeat above step with second strip.

IMPORTANT: You are only pinning one short side at the moment.



Sew 1/4" seam across this short side;
backsewing across each strip for stability.



Now sew 1/4" seam along one long side but
make sure you don't catch the strip in this
seam.



Next sew 1/4" seam along the opposite long
side but leave at least a 2" gap somewhere
in the middle on this side for turning.



Reach inside the remaining open side and
carefully pull each strip to its dot and pin.
You'll be able to feel if you have twisted a
strip and you do want them to be straight.



Sew 1/4" seam across this short side;
backsewing across each strip for stability.

Turn right side out through the gap and iron seams flat.
And your done!
