

# Hints for Using Inktense Pencils

Use good quality fabric brushes  
(stiff, short, synthetic bristles)  
Loew-Cornell fabric brush set #741

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1. Place wet scrubber/round brush to tip of pencil.

May need to tap on scrap fabric/towel to remove some liquid to prevent bleeding before coloring area

Apply wet brush to fabric.

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2. Touch wet scrubber/round brush to tip of pencil to get color.  
Put brush tip into drop of water.  
Continue until you get desired color.
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3. Wet an area of fabric  
Blot with paper towel  
Color lightly with pencil  
Work in with scrubber/round brush

This technique may be used after washing off gel if an area needs more color and you don't want to color and gel again.


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4. To determine strength of color:

Use one pencil to color 1" squares.


- 1 - Color lightly over surface once
- 2 - Color lightly 2 times
- 3 - Color lightly 3 times
- 4 - Color lightly 4 times

Brush each with gel.



5. Shading - Use one color of two shades or more or use different colors.

Use shader brush with gel to blend colors by pulling the darker color into the lighter colors


