# **FAT QUARTERS MAKE**

99 - 2" squares 56 - 2 1/2" squares 42 - 3" squares 30 - 3 1/2" squares 20 - 4" squares 16 - 4 1/2" squares 15 - 5" squares 12 - 5 1/2" squares 9 - 6" squares 6 - 6 1/2" squares

#### **Value**

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Refers to the light or dark of a color, i.e. think of blue, it can be a powder blue (light) or a navy (dark). You will need both in your quilts to make the design stand out.

#### Hue

Refers to the characteristics of any given color. Any particular shade or tint of a color.

# Complementary

Refers to the "opposite" colors on the wheel. These colors produce exciting colors for your design.



yard = 36 inches

7/8 yard = 31.5 inches

3/4 yard = 27 inches

5/8 yard = 22.5 inches

1/2 yard = 18 inches

3/8 yard = 13.5 inches

1/4 yard = 9 inches

1/8 yard = 4.5 inches

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# **QUILT SIZES**

Crib 50" x 53"

Twin 75" x 98"

Full 83" x 106"

Queen 90" x 106"

King 107" x 108"

#### Monochromatic

Refers to one color in a variety of tints, shades and tones. You will want to choose many fabrics to five you more options in your design.

## **Analogous**

Refers to the colors that are side by side on the color wheel. You can use the 3-4 colors on each side of the color wheel to provide more variety in color.

### Tint

You create this by adding white to a color.

# Shade

You create this by adding black to a color.

#### Tone

You create this by adding gray to a color.

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
