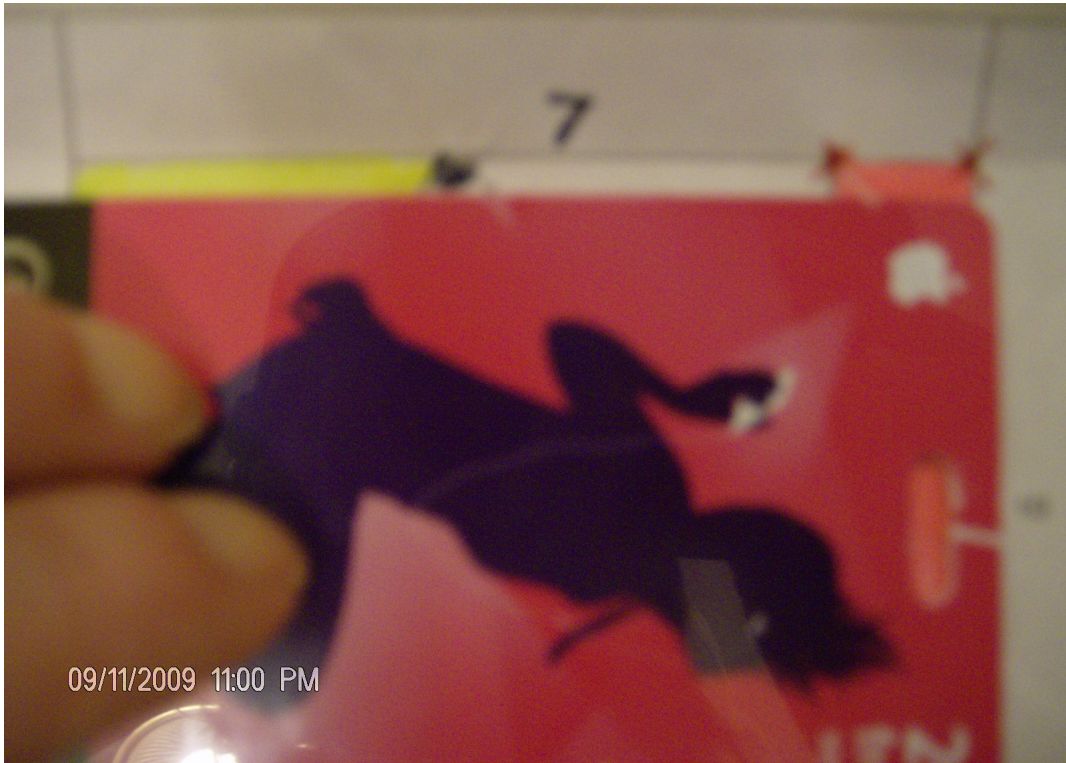
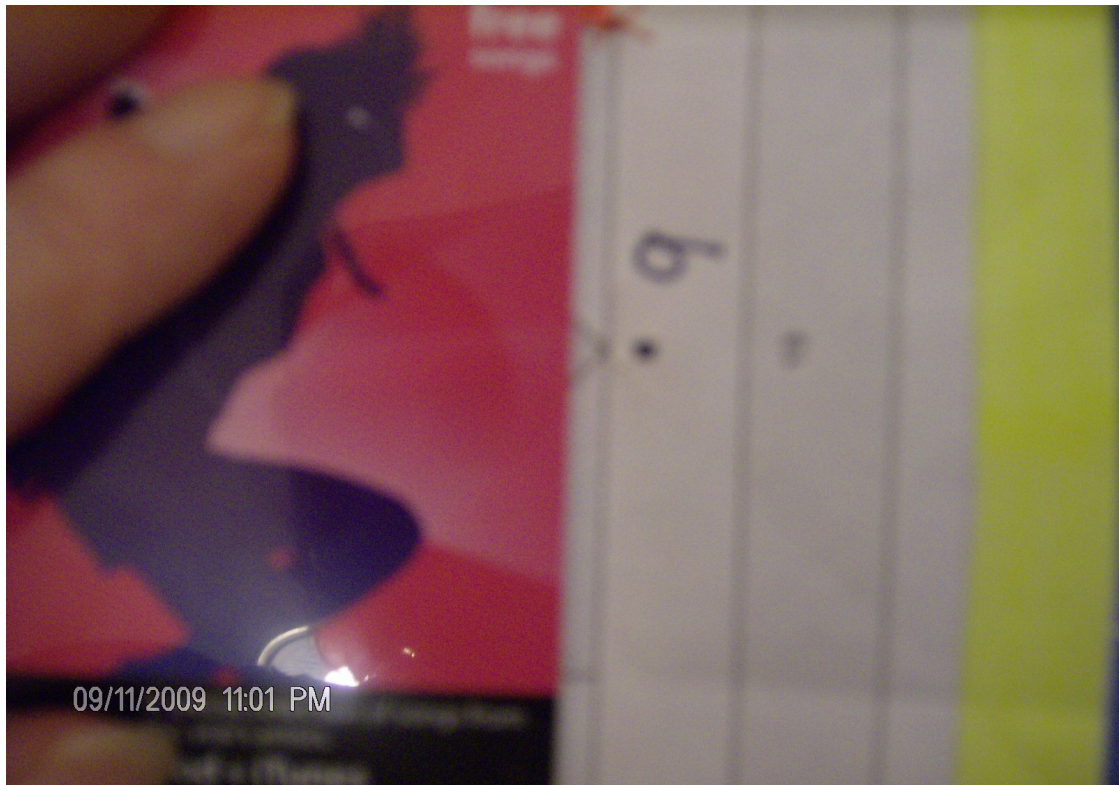


Now we will fold here along the sewing line, and trim again to a $\frac{1}{4}$ "



Turn the paper and fold along this line and trim



Now it should look like this from the back. Oops I took the pic before I trimmed the top. But look at that perfect point!!!

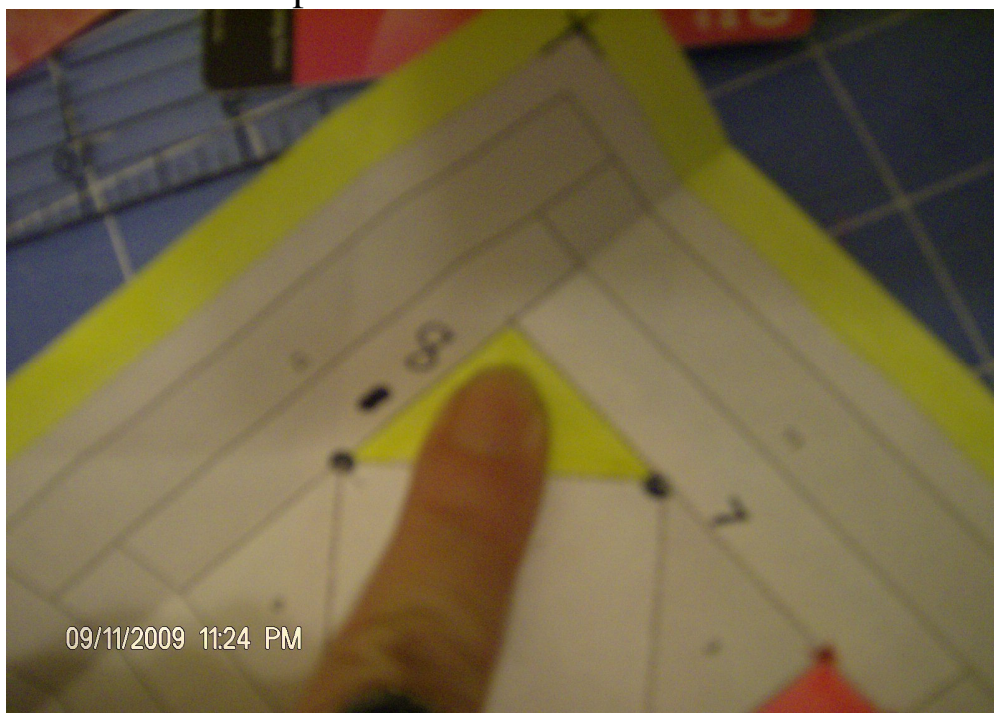


Now on to piece 7, line it up like you did piece 6, turn it over, check it to the light, everything's lined up, slip it under the presser

foot, put the needle down into the fabric one stitch before the intersection, peek under the paper, sew the seam stopping one stitch over the line.

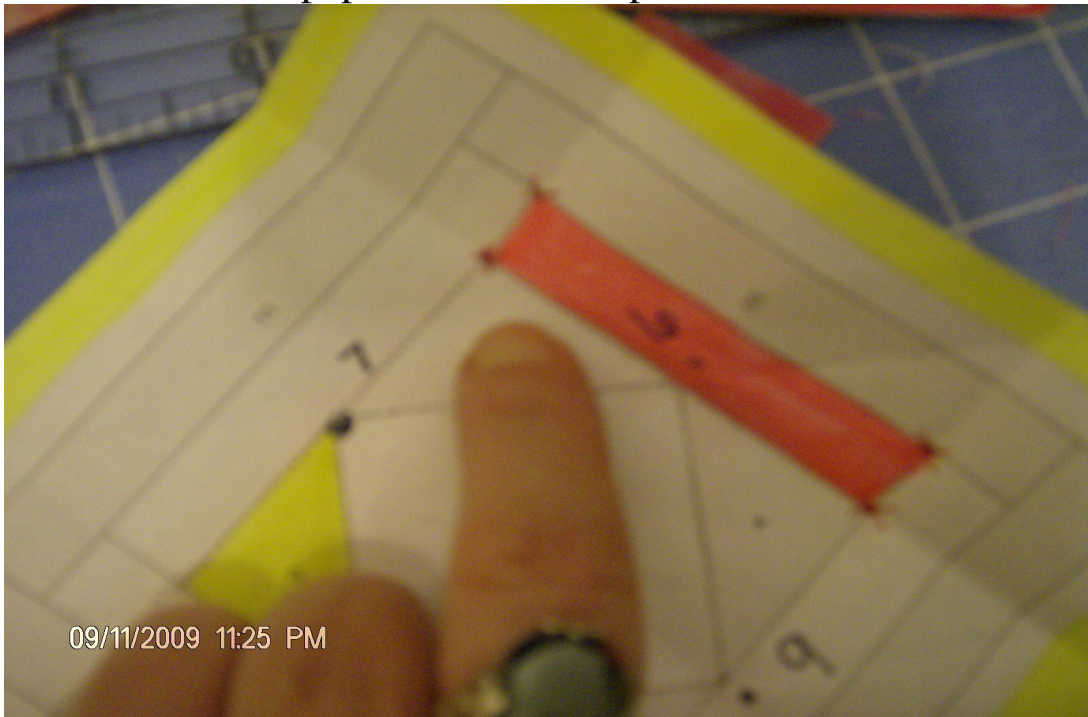


Now we fold along the sewn line again from the front side, trim to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Turn it over and press piece number 7 open. Now we need to trim the sides of piece number 7.



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Turn it back over to the front, fold the paper at the bottom of piece 8, trim. Fold the paper at the end of piece 6 and trim.



Turn it over and it should look like this. Two perfect points now!!!
