I wrote those words over 20 years ago, and they're still true: I want you to have fun with these designs!

As I scanned a 1983 copy of this book in its original format, I was amazed at how much things have changed... and how little.

When I wrote "Fresh Designs", I drew all of the pictures by hand. The dotted lines were freehand, and the text was my own handwriting, sometimes written with guidelines... and sometimes not. Today, I'd probably create the graphics on my computer, and they'd be far more perfect and precise.


Would that detract from their charm? I'm not sure. The energy would certainly be different.


I believe that these designs are still useful today, for the same kinds of projects that I outlined on pages two and three, in addition to their use with quilts.


As I said in the early 1980s, have fun with these designs! (See the last page for copyright info.)


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






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



this design is especially well suited to candlewicking, or a combination of applique & embroidery. perhaps a bright orange applique for the petals, with the detailing in black embroidery?



































HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

these designs were drawn full size, ready to use. you can trace them with a transfer pencil, or you can use plastic to trace & cut permanent stencils. i have my own method: i buy a fairly fine needlepoint canvas (<u>canvas</u>, not nylon or plastic) and trace the design onto the canvas with a <u>permanent</u> ink felt writer: then, i place the canvas on my quilt and use a "vanishing" or water- erasable marker so that the marks go through the holes in the needlepoint canvas, and appear on my quilt.

BE CREATIVE!

there are quilting designs all around you. perhaps you'll see a design in the roses growing up a chain link fence. maybe you could make a repeat design, using the "golden arches" on the placemat at the local hamburger restaurant. jewelry, book covers, and quick-stop convenience stores (our local quick-stop has a sign with a *terrific* hendesign!) can all provide ideas for designs... and this is just the beginning! start looking — experiment - be creative - and have fun!
