## Kitchen Fans

Finished quilt size $911 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 911 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
All strips are to be cut crosswise on the grain of the fabric (width of the fabric) unless otherwise noted.
Yardage is calculated for 42 " wide fabric.
Carefully trim off all selvages. Please read the pattern carefully before you begin.
Fabric Cutting Directions

| Fabric \# | Style \# | Cutting Directions |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| 1 | 5438-1 | Using the quilt pictured as a guide, cut 9 squares $24^{1 / 2 " ~} \times 24^{1 / 2 "}$ from the panel yardage. Each square should contain a carefully centered, large fan motif, exactly as the block appears in the picture of the quilt. Do not cut the panel yardage into small, individual fan blocks. |
| 2 | 5443-2 | Cut 24 strips $2^{3} / 8^{\prime \prime}$ wide for the sashing. From each strip, cut one sashing unit $23 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 24^{1 / 2 " .}$. Cut 10 strips $21 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ wide for the binding. |
| 3 | 5442-3 | Cut 1 strip $2^{3} / 8^{\prime \prime}$ wide for the cornerstones. From this strip, cut 16 squares $23 / 8{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 23 / 8{ }^{\prime \prime}$. |
| 4-48 | Assorted 1930s Prints | From each of twenty fabrics trace one wedge using the template as described below in the section To Make the Border. Then cut 1 strip 2" wide from each fabric. Cut 1 strip 2" wide from each of the remaining twenty-two fabrics. From each 2" strip, cut five rectangles $2 " \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Cut two additional 2 " $\times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from the fabrics of your choice. A total of 212 rectangles is needed to complete the outer border. |

## To Make the Body of the Quilt Top

Using the quilt pictured as a guide, sew a yellow sashing strip to the left side of every fan motif block. Keeping the sashing strip to the left of each block, sew three fan blocks together side by side to make one row of fan blocks. Repeat twice to make a total of three rows. Sew a yellow sashing strip to the right-hand side of each row of fan blocks.
Sew a red cornerstone to the left short side of each of the twelve remaining sashing strips. Sew three sashing units together end to end to make one long row of sashing. Repeat three times for a total of four rows. Sew a red cornerstone to the right-hand side of each row of sashing.
Sew a sashing row to the top of each row of fan blocks. Sew the completed block and sashing units together as shown in the quilt on the cover. Sew the remaining sashing row to the bottom of the quilt top.

## To Make the Border

Using the quilt pictured as a guide, sew 53 of the 2 " $\times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles (long sides together) to make one pieced border unit. Repeat three times. Sew one border unit to the left side and one to the right side of the quilt top.
Using template plastic and the template pattern provided, make a template for the fan blades for the corners of the border. Using the template, cut one fan blade from each of the remaining twenty $2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles. Sew five fan blade pieces together to make one pieced fan block. Make four. Sew a pieced fan block to either end of the two remaining pieced border units, being careful to place each pieced fan as shown on the quilt pictured on the cover. Sew one of the resulting border units to the top and the other to the bottom of the quilt top.
Quilt and bind the completed quilt top as desired.
