

Fabrics

55 Charms (5" x 5" squares) I used 2 packs of 3194 Bold Charms and 1 pack of 3198 Light Charms

 <p>Sashing & Borders I used 2351 Solid White 1-1/2 yds</p>	 <p>Binding I would use 2224 Sparrow Red 1/2 yd if not making it scrappy</p>
 <p>Backing I used 2234 Dove Lt Green 1-1/2 yds</p>	<p>Additional Supplies Needed: Batting that measures 44" x 55" Quilting thread 505 spray</p>

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
Pattern Basics

We encourage breaking the rules, but here are a few things you might want to keep in mind:

- Please read through all the instructions carefully before beginning a project. Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of this pattern.
- All instructions use a 1/4" seam allowance unless otherwise stated.

Common Quilting Acronyms:

FQ = fat quarter (18" x 22") WS = wrong side of fabric
FE = fat eighth (18" x 11") RS = right side of fabric
WOFQ = width of fat quarter HST = half square triangle
WOF = width of fabric



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Directions

NOTE: This is a quilt-as-you-go project, so you will be making the columns but not sewing them together; rather you will sew each row to the backing and batting which then "quilt" it. Make sure you read all the instructions carefully. Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy, but this is my first pattern! 1-1/2 yds

Sashing - Six 3-1/2" x 44-1/2" **Measure sewn rows before cutting**

Two 3-1/2" x 41" **Measure width of quilt top before cutting**



1/2 yd

Binding - Five 2-1/2" x WOF strips or choose five different coordinating precut strips

Backing


Sewing columns:

1. **Charms:** You can either cut all the charms in half or choose some charms you may want to "feature" and keep those whole. I decided to keep 2 charms intact for each column, so I cut 45 charms in half ($2\text{-}1/2" \times 5"$) and kept 10 whole ($5" \times 5"$).
2. Take the pieces from step one and sew them into five columns that equal eleven total whole charms. My columns have two whole charms and 17 half charms.




Putting it together:


3. Fuse your batting and your backing together using 505 spray, then find your center point of the quilt and mark it.




4. Figure out which columns you want where and lay them out in the order you want to sew them. Take your center column and lay it in the middle of your quilt, right side up, matching the center of the column with the mark made in step 3. Next, lay sashing piece face down on charm column, lining up the right hand edge. Pin columns together through all layers. Using thread matching the quilt back (especially in the bobbin too), sew this first column down. Press the sashing open.



5. Line up and pin a column of sashing on the other side, then sew down. Press open. Continue in this manner, alternating between charm columns and sashing, until all the columns are sewn on.



6. Sew on the top and bottom sashing. Press open. Cut off excess batting and backing, squaring up your quilt if needed.



7. Sew on binding using a $\frac{3}{8}$ " seam allowance.
