
Pattern Basics

- All instructions use a 1/4" seam allowance unless otherwise stated.

Common Quilting Acronyms:

FQ = fat quarter (18" x 22")	WS = wrong side of fabric
FE = fat eighth (18" x 11")	RS = right side of fabric
WOFQ = width of fat quarter	HST = half square triangle
WOF = width of fabric	RST = right sides together


Two from Template Body


Black Felt: cut two of head/ears

Directions


1. Mark dots and center bottom of body pieces. Place RST and stitch around sides and top stopping at the dots. Finger press.



2. Mark the dots and center notches on the bottom piece.




- Place RST matching notches and dots. Stitch leaving an opening for stuffing and crushed walnut shells or, I sewed the bottom completely closed and made an opening on the side just big enough to get a little stuffing in for the top of the lamb and filled the rest with the walnut shells. I have a very small funnel so after placing the stuffing I stitched the hole closed just enough to fit the funnel.




Lamb Head/Ears/Tail:


- Whip stitch or blanket stitch the two head pieces together along the edge leaving a small opening along the side of the face. The head will take only very small pieces of stuffing. I used a toothpick to push the stuffing into the head. Once full, whip stitch opening closed.




- With two strands of white embroidery floss make french knots for the eyes. Push the needle up from the back, make french knot and push needle back down to the back. This will create slight indentations and give the little face some dimension.




- Whip stitch the head to the body of the lamb from the back of it's head. A few stitches will do nicely.







- Whip stitch the pom-pom to the other end of the lamb for it's tail.



- To give the lamb a little more dimension stitch some additional french knots in the body. Now she's ready for the pins!
