## **Dresses for Africa Instructions**

## **Materials:**

1 yard (or less) pretty/children's fabric (or combine two to make this amount) 1 yard wide or extra wide double fold bias tape (or make your own) About 2 yards of ribbon (or sewn closed bias tape, or ribbon made from fabric) Embellishments (if desired), for pockets, ruffles, etc.

## **Instructions:**


Cut two:


Cut two pieces of fabric ~ 21" wide by (desired length). These form the back and front of the dress (they are identical, except possibly for embellishments added later).

Length as desired, 20" to 36"


## Both front and back:

Cut rounded triangle out of top two corners, 1-1/2" wide by 6" long (for armholes)






Fold over top about  $\frac{1}{4}$ " and then again about  $\frac{3}{4}$ " - 1". Press if desired, then sew along bottom fold. This makes the casing for the ribbon.



Insert a 6" piece of elastic through the casing and secure with machine stitching at each end so it doesn't come out.



Sew side seams (I allowed about ½" seams). Don't sew up the arm holes! It helps to lock stitches at the top of the seam.

Use about 1 yard of ribbon in the front casing and another 1 yard in the back casing. Secure the ribbon with stitching in the middle so it doesn't come out.

Insert a ribbon through front and back casings.
