Prolong the last flowers of the growing season with an elegant table topper.



INSTRUCTIONS

Completing the Appliqué

Step 1. Fold and crease the 31" tan tonal square in half and in half again as shown in Figure 1. Cut a piece of string at least 20" long and tie it to a pencil. Measure and trim the string with pencil to 151/4" as shown in Figure 2.



Step 2. Pin the end of the string to the center of the folded fabric, and starting on one side of the open edges, trace a line on the fabric with the pencil and string extended as shown in Figure 3; trim the fabric along the marked line and unfold to make the 301/2"-diameter background.

Step 3. Trim the string to 61/2".

Step 4. Cut a 14" x 14" square fusible web. Fold the fusible web and crease lightly to mark the center of the square.

Step 5. Pin the end of the string at the creased center and draw a 13" circle on the fusible web as shown in Figure 4.




