
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Mexican Star Basket

Turn a square block into a fabric basket to hold a plastic bowl liner which can be used to hold candy, a flower arrangement or sewing supplies.



PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS

Project Size: Approximately 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" x 5 1/2"

Block Size: 12" x 12" Number of Blocks: 1

FABRIC & BATTING

- 1/8 yard red mottled
- 1/4 yard fall print
- 1/4 yard muslin
- Batting 16" x 16"
- Backing 16" x 16"
- 1 1/2 yards self-made or purchased binding

SUPPLIES & TOOLS

- All-purpose thread to match fabrics
- Basic sewing tools and supplies

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Prepare one Mexican Star block referring to Figure 1 for placement Piece 1 block placing of colors in the block.

- 2. Sandwich batting between completed block and backing piece; pin or baste layers together.
- 3. Quilt as desired by hand or machine. *Note:* The large muslin areas were machine-quilted in a 1" crosshatch design using red all-purpose thread on the sample shown.
- **4.** When quilting is complete, trim edges even; remove pins or basting. Bind edges with self-made or purchased binding.
- **5.** Place block right side down on a flat surface. Pull the muslin 1 squares in so that the side points of the corner units touch and a V shape is formed as shown in Figure 2; pin to hold. Repeat this process on the three other muslin 1 squares to make a basket shape. Adjust the formed V shapes to make uniform.





Figure 3 Sew along each pinned V to make a tuck in each side approximately 3" long as shown.

- 6. Sew along each pinned V to make a tuck in each side approximately 3" long as shown in Figure 3.
- 7. Hand-stitch each tuck to the inside of the formed

basket to finish. Insert plastic liner, if desired. �





Mexican Star Basket Placement Diagram Approximately 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" x 5 1/2"

PIECING INSTRUCTIONS


- 1. Referring to the Piecing Diagram to piece one block, sew a medium E6 to a dark ER6; sew a dark E6 to a medium ER6. Join the two units; set in a light 27 and two light 126 triangles. Add a dark T6 to complete one corner unit; repeat for four corner units.
- **2.** Arrange the units in rows with one dark and four light 1 squares referring to the Piecing Diagram. Join units in rows; join rows to complete one block.





