

## Step 1

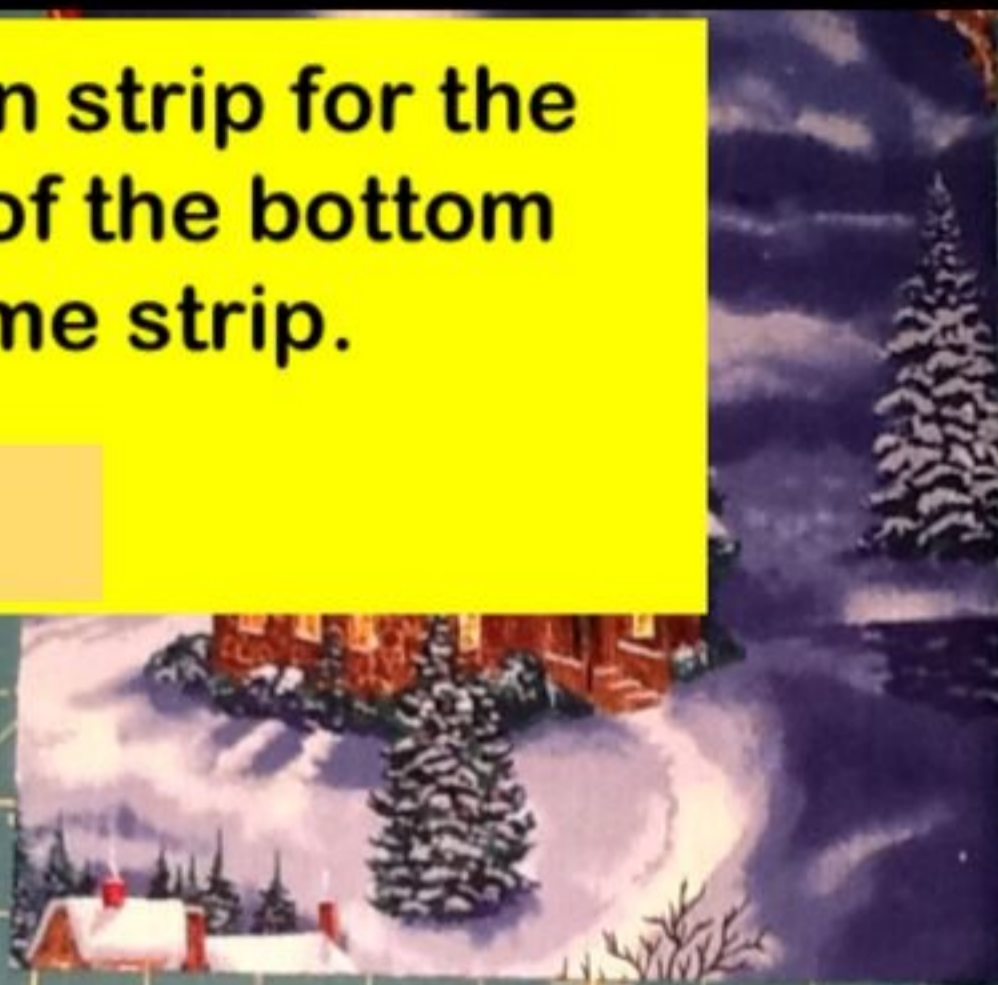


**Cut block and frames to desired size. Add 3" to the length of the framing strips.**



**Cut a thin strip for the  
"edge" of the bottom  
frame strip.**

**Step 2**





### Step 3

Sew the first strip to the block. **STOP** sewing at the 1/4" mark. Backstitch to secure.







**Step 5**

**Note the stitching stopped at the 1/4" mark.**





**Step 6**

I press the strip allowance toward the block. Note the 1/4" stitching at the corner does NOT "meet". You need this room to make the mitered corner.

**Step 7**

**Press the strips.**



Now the fun begins! Fold the top strip at a 45 degree angle. You can see that I use the strips as a guide to do this. Note where I pinned.

## Step 8

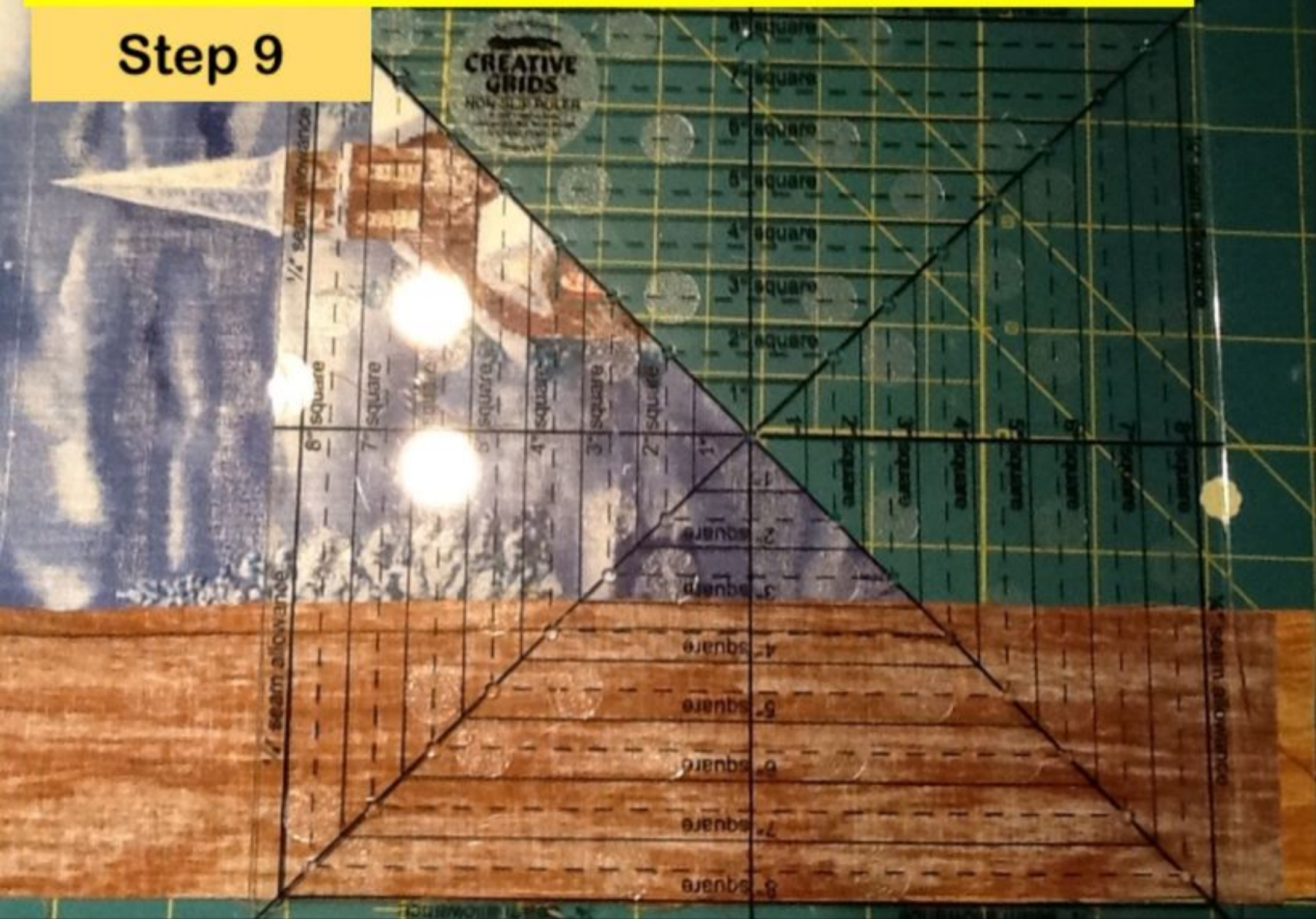
To check your "miter",  
fold the block diagonally  
matching the frame  
"seams".





Use your ruler to double-check the angle. This will be your stitching guide.

## Step 9





Mark your stitching line. You will **STOP** at the 1/4" seam allowance. (Where the previous stitching stopped.). More practice at this! It gets easier as you go along. Really!

## Step 10





**Go back and cut off the  
excess strip length.**

**Step 11**





I carefully snip off that little triangle piece. Gets rid of bulk.

Step 12



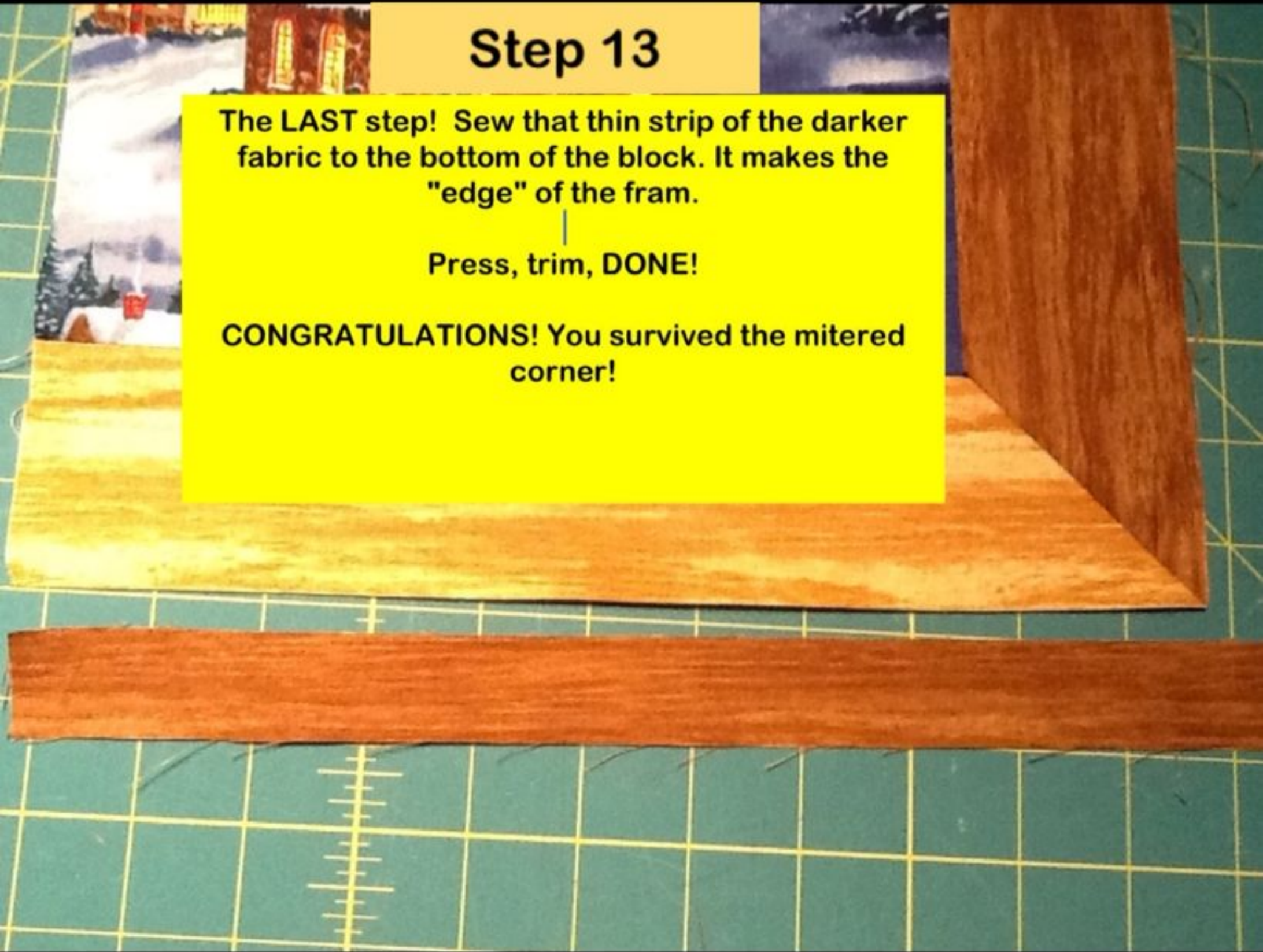


## Step 13

The **LAST** step! Sew that thin strip of the darker fabric to the bottom of the block. It makes the "edge" of the fram.

Press, trim, **DONE!**

**CONGRATULATIONS!** You survived the mitered corner!
