



## Materials

*Yardages based on 42" wide fabric*

1 panel - Sew-Much-Love (10170-1)  
 1/3 yard - Yellow Paisley (10173-1)  
 1/4 yard - Teal Tonal (10176-4)  
 1/4 yard - Lavender Tonal (10176-2)  
 1/2 yard - Pink Tonal (10176-3)-  
 including binding  
 1/3 yard - Green Paisley (10173-5)  
 1/3 yard - Lavender Stripe (10174-2)  
 1/2 yard - Lavender Toss (10171-2)  
 1 1/2 yards - Backing for pockets and  
 wall hanging. Suggested: Pink Floral  
 (10172-3)

## Cut the Fabrics

*WOF = Width of Fabric*

*LOF = Length of Fabric*

### From the Sew-Much-Love panel cut:

5 framed squares with 1/4" seam  
 allowance around sides. 1 to 5 images  
 for pincushions

### From the Yellow Paisley cut:

2 - 5" WOF strips cut into:

12 - 5" squares

1 - 5" x 18 1/2" rectangle

### From the Teal Tonal cut:

4 - 5" squares

### From the Lavender Tonal cut:

4 - 5" squares

### From the Pink Tonal cut:

2 - 5" squares

4 - 2 1/2" x WOF binding strips

### From the Green Paisley cut:

2 - 5" squares

4 - 1 1/2" WOF strips

### From the Lavender Stripe cut:

4 - 2 1/2" x WOF strips

### From the Lavender Toss cut:

4 - 3 1/2" x WOF strips

### From the Pink Floral cut:

1 - 9 1/2" x WOF strip cut into:

backs for each of four pockets

### Assemble Block A (four patch blocks)

1. Sew two green paisley 5" squares and two yellow paisley 5" squares into a four patch block as shown in Figure 1. Press the seams toward the darker square. Press the center seam down. Repeat to make one block using the pink tonal, two blocks using the teal tonal and two blocks using the lavender tonal. The unfinished size of the blocks is 9 1/2".



### Assemble the Quilt

1. Lay out the four patch blocks as shown in the quilt picture. Sew into three rows and then sew the three rows together. Press this center unit.
2. Add the yellow paisley 5" x 18 1/2" rectangle to the bottom of the center unit.
3. Add the lavender stripe border by measuring the length of the quilt center. Trim two 2 1/2" wide strips to that length and sew to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Press the seam allowance towards the border. Measure the width of the quilt and trim two lengths to that measurement. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press the seam allowances toward the border.
4. Measure the center of the quilt lengthwise and trim two lengths of the 1 1/2" Green Paisley strips to this measurement. Sew these borders to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Press seams out toward the borders. Measure the width of the quilt and trim two lengths of the remaining Green Paisley strips to this measurement. Pin and sew these borders to the top and bottom edges of the quilt, matching raw edges. Press seams out toward the borders.
5. Repeat to add the 3 1/2" strips of the lavender toss strips for the outside border. Press the seams outward.
6. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing. Quilt the top.

### Adding the Pockets

1. Cut out matching squares of batting (two squares of batting for each pocket) and the pink floral backing fabric for each framed pocket square. Layer the pocket top on top of the batting and place the floral print backing right sides facing on top of the pocket square. Sew a 1/4" seam around the square leaving an opening on the bottom as shown in Figure 2. Trim the corners. Turn the pocket inside out and sew the opening shut by hand. Repeat with the remaining four framed squares. Press the pockets. Machine quilt lines in the pockets to strengthen them.
2. Center the pockets and pin on the four patch blocks as shown in the quilt picture. Top stitch along the left and right sides and bottom to make a pocket.



### Add the Pincushions

1. Cut out 1 - 5 images for trapunto pincushions for raw edge appliqué. Add a 1/4" seam allowance all around the images if you want to turn under the edges. Cut out batting to fit behind the images. Cut out more layers of batting if you want a fat pincushion. Layer on the images on top of the batting and pin to the yellow paisley rectangle or the green paisley four patch block. Applique the raw edge with a blanket stitch by machine or hand stitching. Repeat to add as many pincushions as you desire.
2. Add machine quilting around the pocket top stitching and inside the pincushions to make the trapunto lines. Trim away the excess batting and backing and add the binding.
