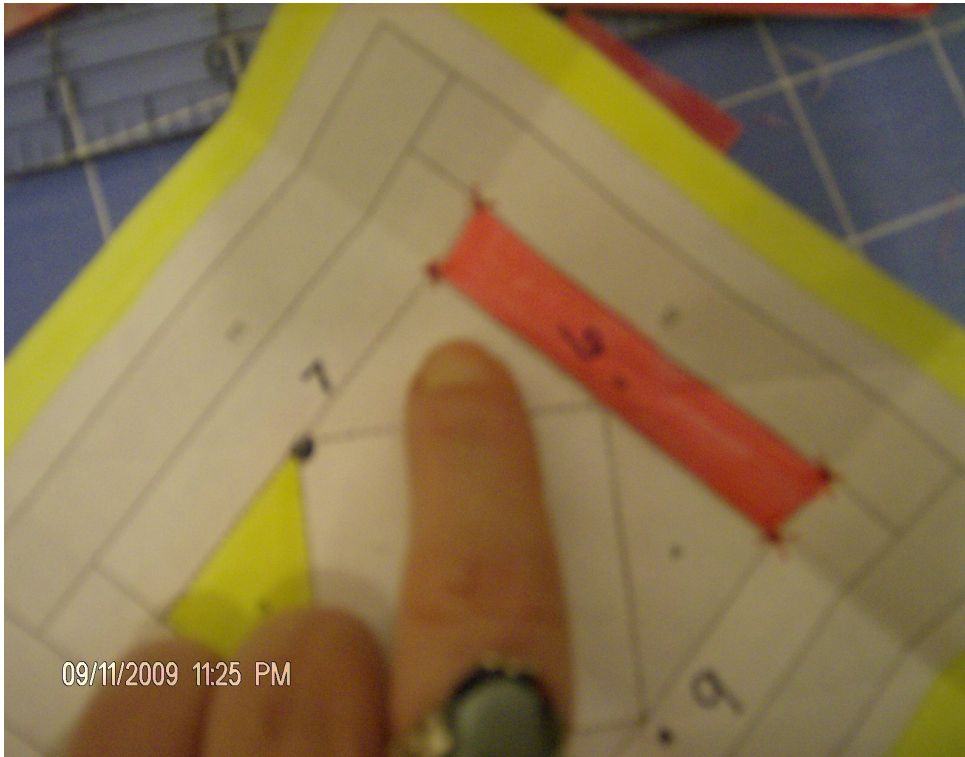
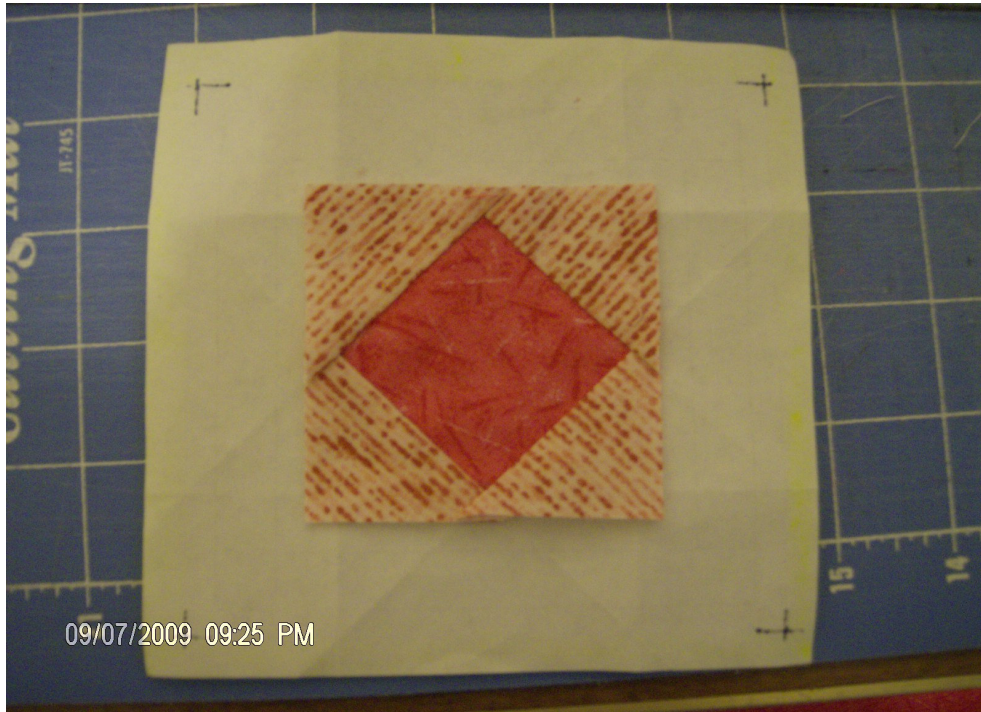


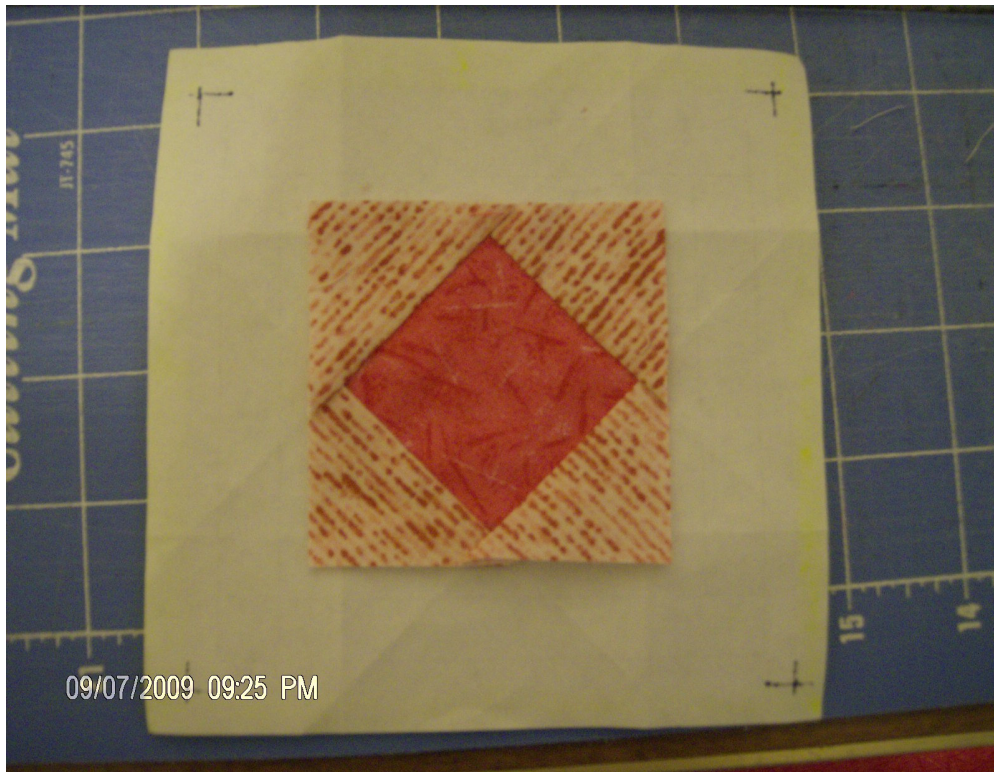
Now turn it over to the right side and we are going to fold over the next set of lines and do some trimming. I have made piece 6 pink here. You will want to fold at the line at the bottom of this piece and trim the fabric to  $\frac{1}{4}$ ".



Fold the next one, at the bottom of 7, trim and continue around until you have gone all the way around and trimmed below piece 9. This is basically the same thing you did with the first inner square.



So, now we are all trimmed and look like this



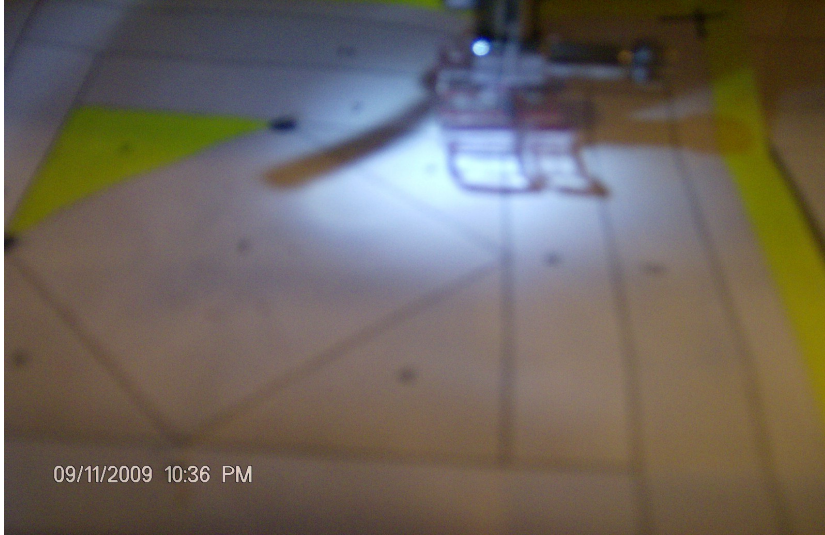
So Pretty!!! And now we are ready for pieces 6, 7, 8, and 9!!!

On the front, find where piece 6 is and then turn over to find where it goes on the back. Piece 6 goes right sides together, and line it up as in the picture below.

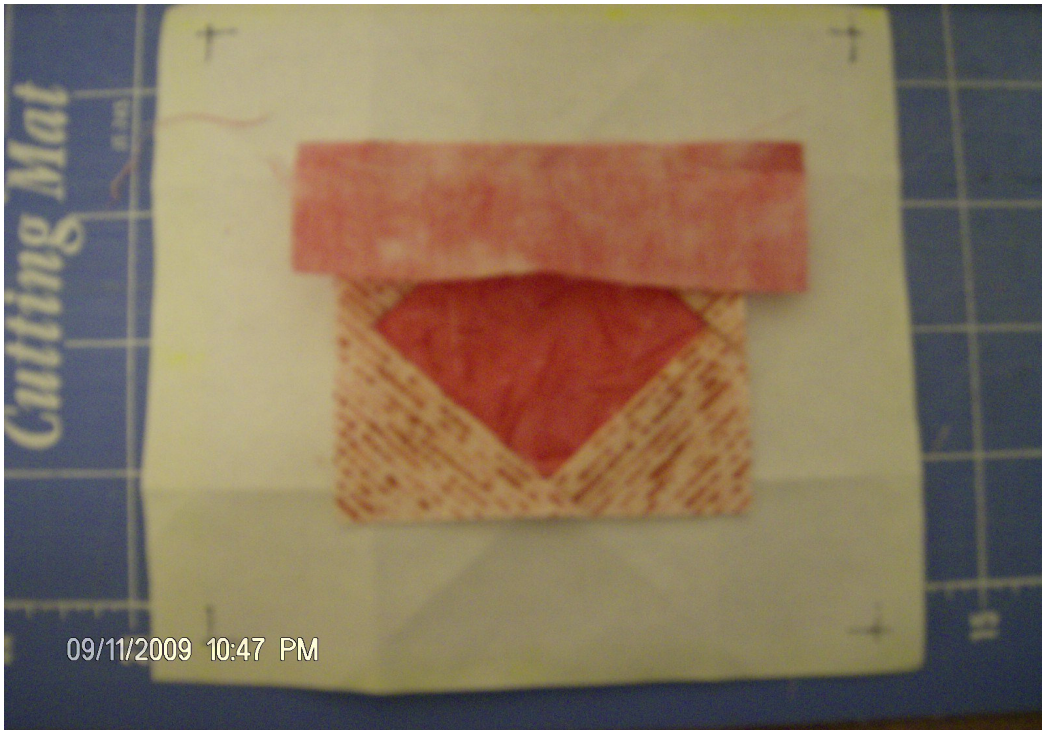


On pieces this small I do not pin them, the pins just get in the way. I carefully turn it over, check it by holding it up to the light, and slide it under my presser foot. Get it positioned as before one stitch before the intersection, and put my needle down, then I peek under the paper to see if the fabrics are still positioned correctly. This is another place having the pieces a little bigger comes in handy!

Ok, now we have sewn the seam, time to trim. Fold the paper from the front again, along the seam line you just sewed. Trim the seam allowance to 1/4". This is what it looks like from the back.



Now let's look at the front again, this is a log pattern looking row. I colored the section pink to make it stand out. So we need to 2 more times to get ready for the next piece. We already trimmed the top, now we need to trim the left and the right sides.
