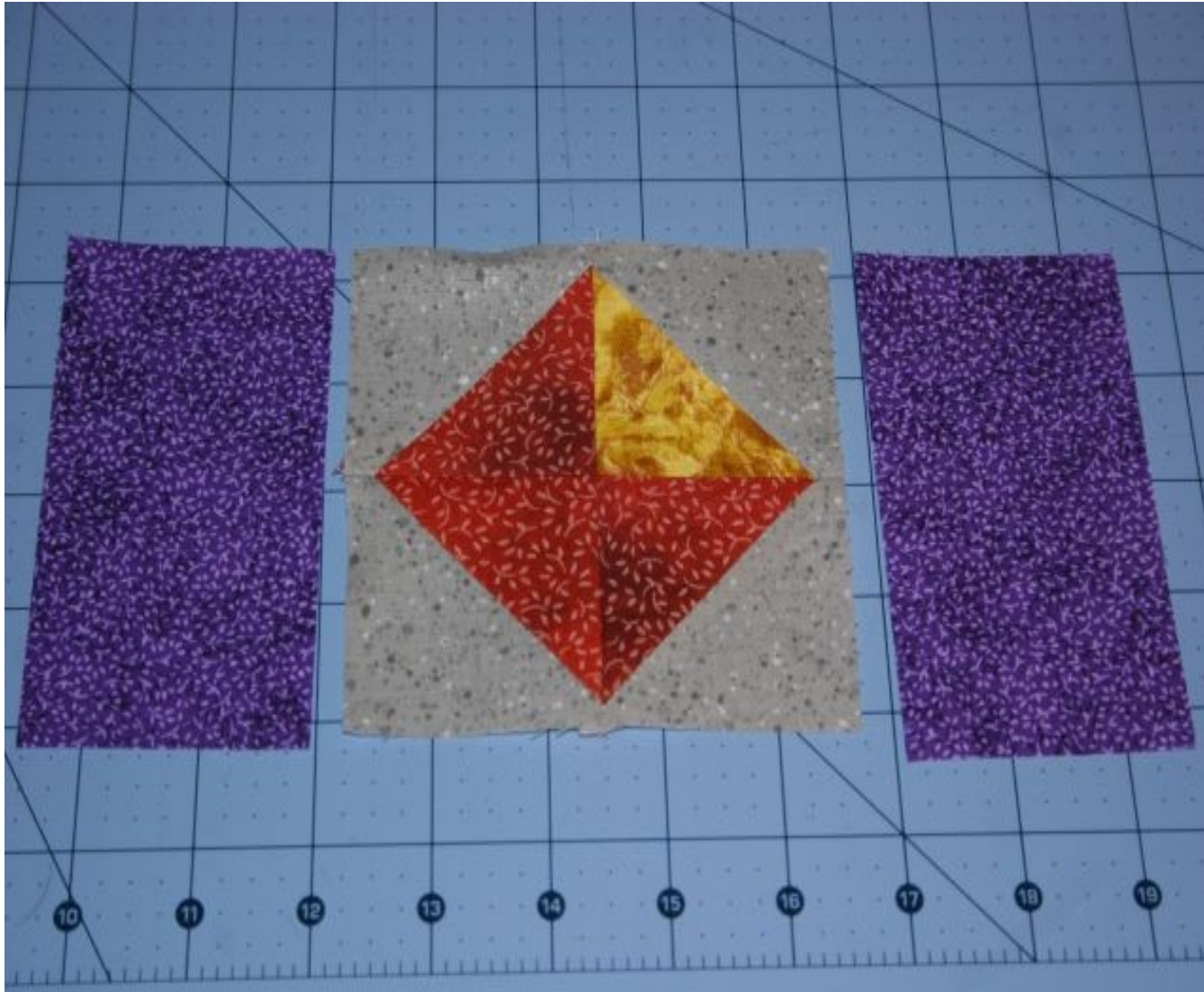


Clue 3



Supplies:

All of the blocks
from Clue 2

Half of your Color 1
rectangles

2 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Step 1



Align Color 1 rectangle with the block from Clue 2. We'll do it this way so you will not have to worry about twisting the seam.

Step 2

Iron to the right.



Step 3



Sew it on the block side so you can see where you are going and you don't have to fight the seam. When you use your $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam make sure when you go across you cross over the X so you don't cut off or leave too much room on your points.

Step 4



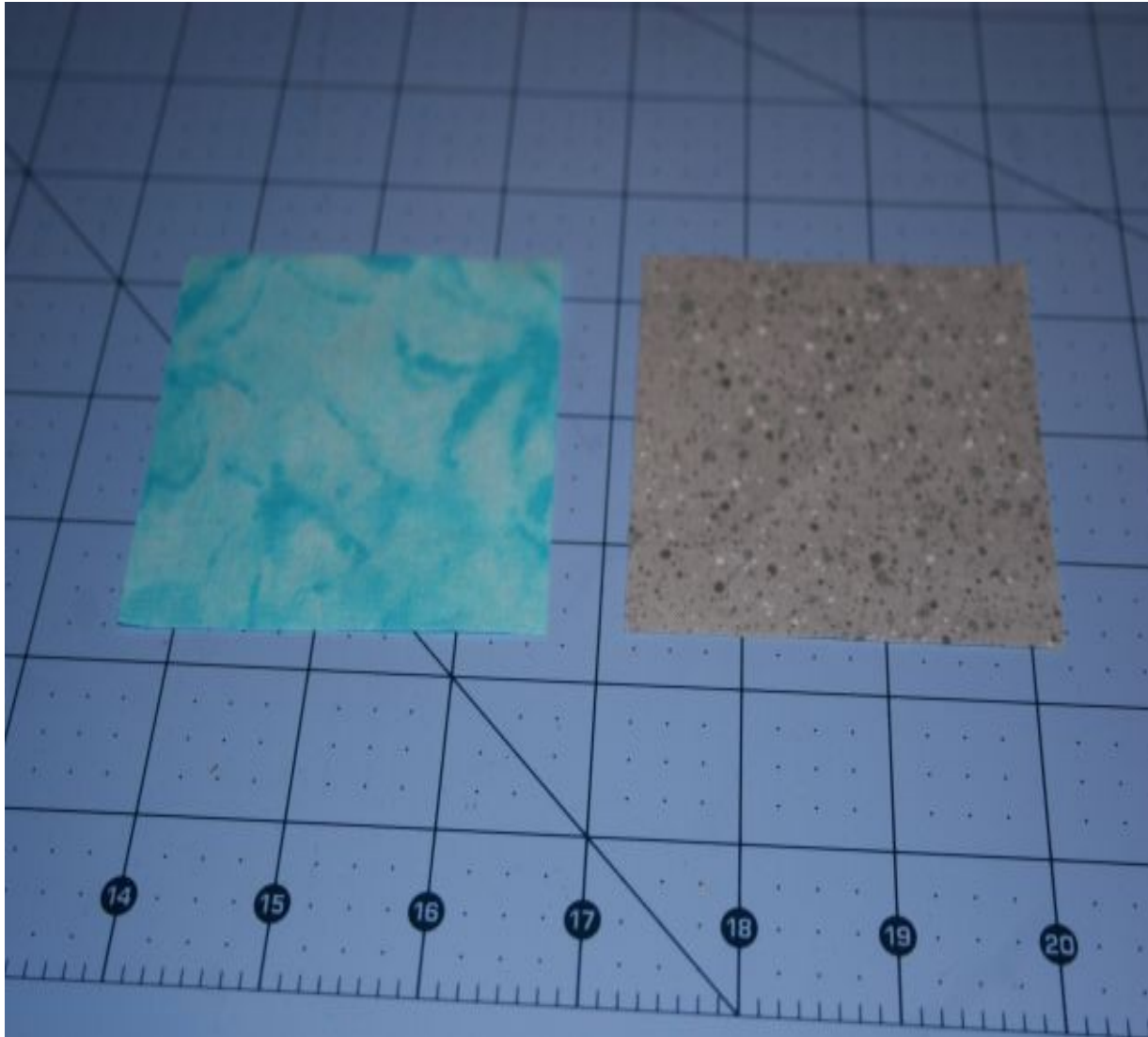
Get second Color 1
2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangle.

Step 5



Sew this side in the same manner. This is what it will look like. Press to the right.

Clue 3a



Supplies:

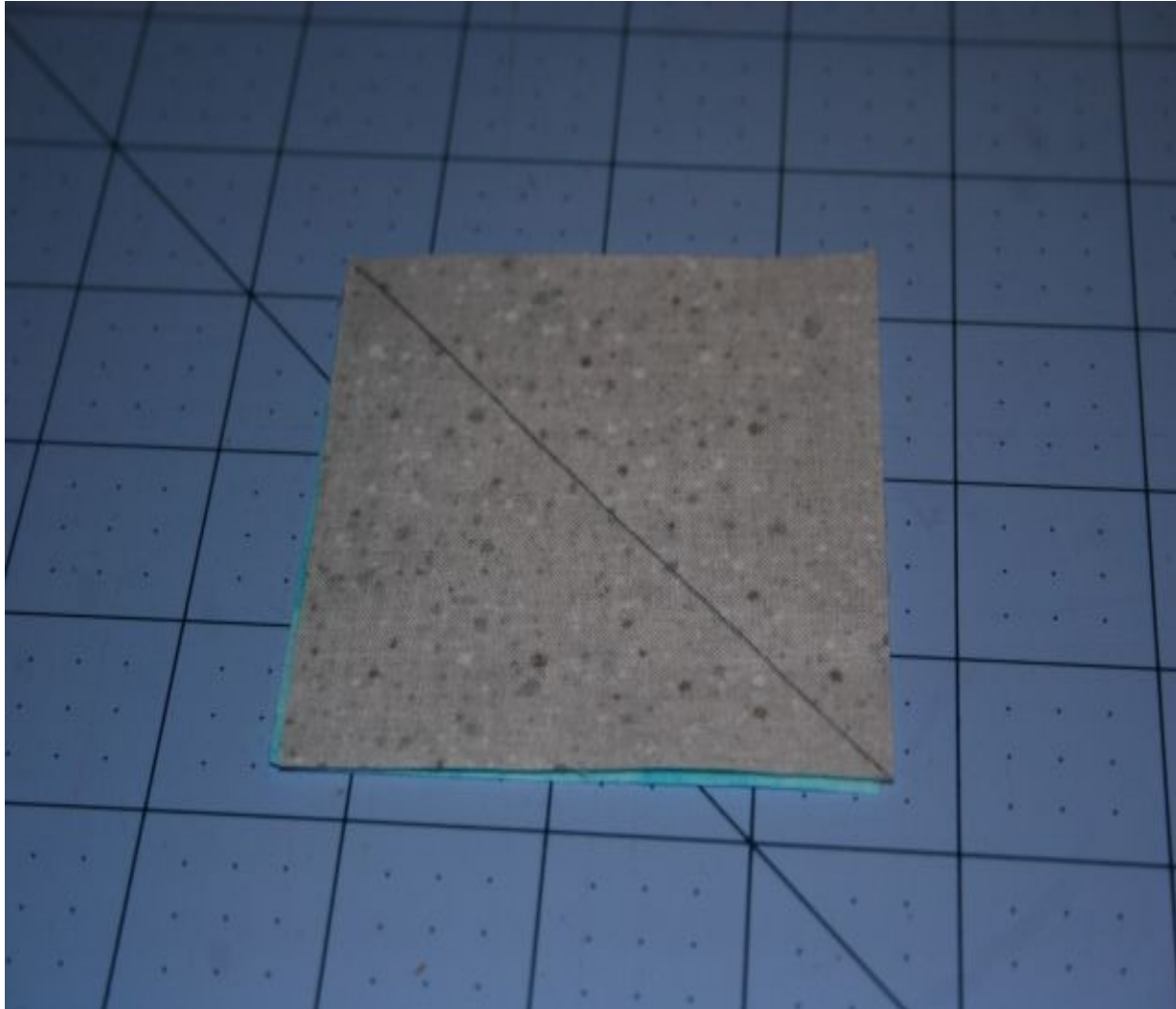
All of the following:

3" 2nd accent square

3" background square

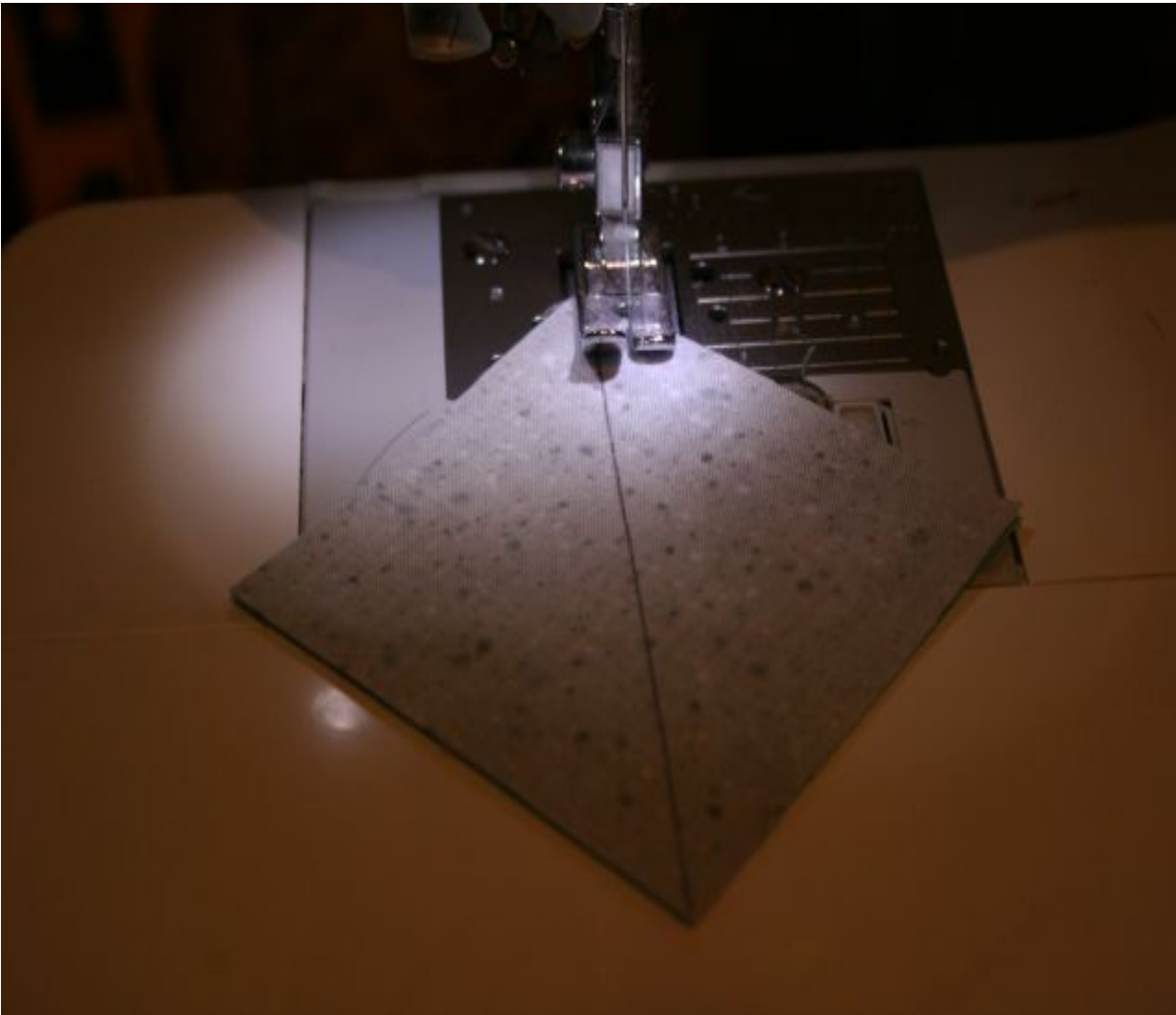
*We will be using all of these pieces together.

Step 1 (clue 3a)



Draw a line diagonally on the background 3" square. Repeat this process for all these pieces.

Step 2 (Clue 3a)



Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " on the side of the diagonal line. Like the last time in Clue 2, sew both sides cut and iron to the 2nd accent.

Clue 3b



Supplies:

Half Squares from Clue 3a measuring $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Divide the Rectangles from Color1 into four equal piles. They will measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ x $4\frac{1}{2}$.

Step 1 (Clue 3b)

Align half square with the 2nd accent at the top and put Color 1 rectangle on top. Sew this way so you don't have to fight the seam.



Step 2(Clue 3b)



Sew second half square on the other side like this.. again so you don't have to worry about going over a big seam. Press seams to the right. I got excited and did not take a picture of the final seam. The piece will look like page10. I apologize for not taking the last picture for this!
