# Prairie Points and Squares on point

## Making front Pocket

1. Choose any fabrics you like. I choose 3 different ones.



- 2. You will need to cut the following
  - a. Print A cut 2 -3 inch strips (2x44)
  - b. Print B cut 1-3 in strip (2x44)



- 3. Sew these strips together print B goes in the center of the two strips of print A.
- 4. Now cut 10-3 inch sets



1. Then sew the 3 inch sets so in a staggered pattern

## 2. Trim to make a long rectangle




3. Cut a 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  strip and sew that to the long rectangle





4. Now take this long set and sew it to the 2" strip that is with the squares that are on point.



- 5. Now cut the following
  - a. Print A cut 4-3 strips again
  - b. Print C cut 2-3 strips again
- 6. Sew strips A and strips C together, strip C goes in the center.
- 7. Cut the strip sets into 7 inch sets.
- 8. Then sew the sets together making stripes





- 9. Iron the front pocket piece you just made.
- 10. Layer with batting and backing fabric quilt as you wish.



11. Cut the extra batting and backing off even with the pocket.



12. Attach the prairie points to the top of the quilted pocket.



- 13. Cut a 4" strip from contrasting color for the top of the binding.
  - a. Fold the 4" strip in half and press.
  - b. Sew to the front of the pocket (side with prairie points)



c. Fold over edge and hand stitch to complete binding.





d. Serge or zing zag the edge of the bag this will make it easier to sew when completing the bag.



### **Making Prairie Points**

- 1. Cut 2-3" strips, in contrasting color
- 2. Cut the 3" strips into 3" squares
- 3. Then fold the 3" square diagonally and iron
- 4. Then fold the triangle again and press



5. Baste the prairie points together at the top inserting one into the next. Into a long strip that will go along the top of the front pocket





6. Make 60 prairies point because you will use them for the top of the bag as well.

### Make the Large pocket of the bag

- 1. Cut the following
  - e. Print B cut 1 -3" strip
  - f. Print C Cut 2-3" strips
- 2. Sew these strips together put Print B in the middle
- 3. Now cut 10-3 inch sets
- 4. Then sew the 3 inch sets so in a staggered pattern
- 5. Trim to make a long rectangle
- 6. Cut from print B 1-2 ½ in Strip, attach to the long rectangle.
- 7. Cut from print A 1- 12" strip attach to the long rectangle



8. Iron the large pocket that you just made.

- 9. Layer with batting and backing, quilt as you like
- 10. Cut excess batting and backing material.
- 11. Attach prairie points Do not attach the prairie points from one end 4-5. You will see these once the bag is almost done. Fold them back and pin to hold them out of the



almost done. Fold them back and pin to hold them out of the way while finishing the

12. Serge or zigzag the edge of the bag this will make it easier to sew when completing the bag.



#### Finish the Bag

- 1. Find the center of both the small pocket and Large Pocket.
- 2. Lay the small pocket on top of the large pocket matching the centers, and the bottoms as well.
- 3. Pin in place.



- 4. Stitch up the center until you meet the 2" strip.
- 5. Fold the bag right sides together, and match the top of the small pocket pieces.
- 6. Make sure that all edges meet
- 7. Serge or zig-zag the edges together, make sure you are catching all edges. (I zig-zagged mine and I put 2 rows of zig-zag in to make the seam stronger.)



8. Unpin the prairie points and stitch in place over the seam. (this hide the top of the seam)



- 9. Cut a 4" strip from contrasting color for the top of the binding.
  - a. Fold the 4" strip in half and press.
  - b. Sew to the front of the pocket (side with prairie points)
  - c. Fold over edge and hand stitch to complete binding.

#### Make the handles

- 1. Cut 2-3" strips of contrasting color
- 2. Fold the strip back on itself



- 3. Cut a piece of batting to match the strip.
- 4. Place the strip on top of the batting (already with right sides together) and sew down on both sides.
- 5. Turn, poke out corners, and iron flat





- 6. Stich the bottom closed.
- 7. Attach the handles to the bag,
- 8. Hand stitch the handles to the bag.



9. Turn the bag right side out and it is now complete!!!!!
